

What is Source Water Protection

 The objective of source water protection is to maintain, safeguard, and/or improve the quality of the source water used for drinking water.




Why Source Water Protection

- Multiple barrier approach
- Can reduce treatment costs.
- Can reduce risks to public health from exposures to contaminated water.
- Shows that water providers are good stewards of the resource

Fundamental Elements of SWP

- 1. Program vision and stakeholder involvement
- 2. Source water *characterization*
- 3. Source water protection *goals*
- 4. Source water protection *action plan*
- 5. Implementation of action plan
- 6. Periodic *evaluation and revision* of the entire program

Vision & Stakeholder Involvement

- Vision express the commitment to SWP
- Stakeholder Involvement critical to SWP development and implementation



Characterization of Source Water

- Delineation
- Water quality and quantity data
- Contaminant sources, land uses, and other threats
- Inventory of regulations



SWP Goals

Program goals – you should have written goals



SWP Action Plan

- Identifies required actions
- Establishes priorities and timelines
- Indentifies projects, activities and programs to achieve SWP



Program Implementation

 Should be a combination of voluntary and regulator programs, sound practices and drinking water advocacy

Evaluation & Revision

- Should be done periodically
- Adaptive management
- Identify gaps and shortcomings
