Key Highlights:

 On Tuesday, September 24th, The Water Treatment and Research Committees hosted a membrane workshop, which was well attended, and provided 0.5 CEUs to operators from WA and OR. The membrane workshop was a success, with about 35 in person attendees and about 10 virtually.

Background and Summary

Together, the Water Science Division Committees – Research, Treatment, Quality, and Resources – developed 8 full tracks, 6 early bird sessions and three tours for Boise 2025.
